One of the most beloved songs written by Rev. Lorenzo Lyons who arrived as a missionary in Waimea, Hawai`i. He translated more than 900 hymns, became a citizen of Hawai`i and died in Waimea, Oct. 6, 1886. This song is traditionally sung, standing, with held-hands, at the end of Hawaiian gatherings.
